GREAT NEED FOR BIBLES

Of all the places we have served, Malawi and Mozambique have a desperate need for Bibles in their languages. Many years ago the Gideons gave New Testaments in schools. Those are all worn out and no one is giving Bibles now that we know about. The Bibles are more expensive there around \$6 to \$10 a Bible because the country has to import most all of their products. For example, Duane bought a can of shaving cream in Malawi last time and it cost \$8 there. Every dollar given for Bibles goes directly to purchase Bibles. One fifth grade Sunday School class is raising money for Bibles for this mission.
