Dear Praying Friends;

We have just returned from East Asia and our hearts are filled with praise and thanksgiving to our Mighty God! He is so faithful and all sufficient. Our hearts are feeling torn because we left a part of ourselves with those dear believers. Yet there is a new faith and warmth in our hearts which we have brought home with us from having been around our precious brothers and sisters there. Before we adjourned each meeting, we would quote the Lords prayer together (them in their language and us in English). We would sing the same hymns (them in their language and us in English). It is truly a foretaste of our future worship in heaven. We will always carry with us their smiles, tears, and faith even without knowing many of their names.

We started out sharing the Gospel with three different groups in three locations. There were three conversions for salvation and one for baptism but many seeds of the Gospel were sown. Please pray right now that those seeds will bring forth fruit for our Lord Jesus Christ.

We felt your prayers so many times. One particular time was when we were at the gate waiting for our plane and the sign read a different city than where we knew we were going. It took quite a process and three different sources before we got it straight. Also, one time we were crossing a busy street at night and the traffic was so bad that we got across one lane and waited in the middle of traffic at least 5 minutes before the other lane cleared enough to cross. Deanna stepped out in front of a bicycle that just barely missed her. We were in several traffic jams but no accidents, sometimes traveling inches from cars on both sides. We were well the whole trip with no bronchitis or back problems. Duane had light flashes in his eyes before we left but they went away.

BIBLE DISTRIBUTION

The Lord led us to purchase the Bibles in a different way than last year. They were a little more expensive but all are whole Bibles and some Study Bibles. We were able to purchase 3600 which were distributed in the three different locations where we worked. When we told this one man about the Bibles, he said, "Just this week the believers were asking where we could get some Bibles because they were really needed there". God is always right on time. Praise His Name! It was a new experience working out how to deliver them without causing suspicion so please pray for that even now.



BIBLE TEACHING

Altogether we taught around 32 hours in three different locations. The translations and copies were ready for us when we arrived. The leaders and pastors were so grateful for the printed material so they could teach it later. In the three evening group which was the same as we had last time, there were around 60 attending. The second night we arrived we had a few anxious minutes as there was a police car parked just outside the gate entrance where we were to meet so we walked right on by and had a coke in a small restaurant nearby. Later it was safe. One special testimony was from a young woman who ran up to us saying in English, "I m changed! Im changed!" The rest of her testimony was in her language but the interpreter shared this—"she said that when she came last year she was having so many family problems with her husband and her mother-in-law but she began obeying the teaching and her whole life changed. Because of the drastic change in her life, her mother-in-law was even coming to the teachings this year." Gods Word does change lives and we give Him all the glory!

The second meeting was with only church pastors and leaders.

They were so attentive and excited. We taught two days all day including some discussion and sharing times. The Lord provided excellent interpreters, one of those was the one who translated the teaching material. They are already planning on our coming back next year to teach more. There were around 15 different churches represented at these meetings.

The third meeting was with some of the leaders from last year but many new pastors and leaders from 10 different churches in this area. It was a special blessing to see and visit with the ones from last year. Some of the new leaders were full time ministry workers with students. They were so eager to learn and took lots of notes. We are so grateful for the privilege of teaching His Word. Psalm 92. 14-15LB has become a precious promise to us. "Even in old age they will still produce fruit and be vital and green. This honors the Lord, and exhibits His faithful care. He is my shelter. There is nothing but goodness in Him!"

Our four day personal vacation (not on ministry provision) which we purposely took because we were, "tourists", was restful and beautiful.

Please pray for the Lords provision in various ways because this will be the longest, most extensive and expensive mission we have attempted yet. The need for Bibles is so great in these outer areas. Because of the cost of airfare, we feel we should work both countries while we are in Africa. If the Lord leads you to be a part of this with your end of the year giving, that would be an eternal investment with great returns.

Just before we left in October, we had two dear prayer partners claim their mansions in heaven, Wilma Deel and Bill Willard. We thank God for how they impacted our lives and ministry. Please pray for their families.
